### Fresh Fruits and Vegetables – HEIRLOOM CHERRY TOMATOES & WATERMELON RADISH

Heirloom cherry tomatoes are petite, round cherry tomatoes that come in an array of flavors and assortment of colors; from pale yellow and sun-gold orange to bright red, Cherokee purple and marbled green. They are juicy, low-acidic, with high sugar content. Dating at least from the 1800s, heirloom tomatoes are prized for their rich, tomato flavor and varied shapes and sizes. These tomatoes are a good source of potassium, vitamin A, vitamin C, some calcium and iron.

The Watermelon radish is made up of an edible globular root attached to a thin stem. Did you know that when eating radishes, you are actually eating a root? Its exterior is creamy white in color with pale green shoulders, a sign of the chlorophyll it received from exposure to the sun. The Watermelon radish's flesh is white, closest to the exterior, becoming bright, circular striations of pink and magenta. Hence the watermelon reference. Its flesh is tender but crisp. Its flavor is mild, only slightly peppery with almond-sweet notes. Depending on when harvested, Watermelon radishes can range in size from a golf ball to a soft ball.
