May Builder's Theme – "I am a Builder when I am Respecting my body and mind"

By now, we all recognize the direct connection between mental and physical wellbeing. One impacts the other, for better and for worse. The question is how to achieve — and maintain — balance between our mind and body in today's fast-paced world, where stress is a top global health concern.

Approximately 1 in 75 people may experience panic disorder at some point throughout their lives, according to the National Institute of Mental Health. Mental health is such a top concern around the world today. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), the economic consequence of disregarding mental health, i.e., not treating depression and anxiety disorders, costs the world \$1 trillion a year. They state that for every \$1 that is spent on treatments for mental health, governments could receive a return on investment of \$4. In other words, prioritizing mental health is a vital part of promoting and achieving overall health. You don't have to be a global expert to invest in your own mental health. Simply recognizing the intimate relationship between the human body and mind goes a long way in successful treatment and preventative health care. For instance, scientific research shows that a positive, self-empowering mindset not only greatly impacts how we feel, but also the way we move and how we live our daily lives. In turn, negative, self-limiting thoughts can be both mentally and physically crippling.

Exercise has been proven to nurture and strengthen both our mental and physical health. Scientific studies have shown that for those suffering from depression, exercise is an effective long-term alternative to medicine. Even if you aren't suffering from depression, exercise releases endorphins, which elevate our mood. The better you feel, the more likely you are to keep physically active. The more exercise and physical activities you do on a regular basis, the better physical and mental shape you will be in.

The bottom line: a healthy mind leads to a healthy body and vice versa. So be good to your mind and body; think about what you feed both of them. Be selective about what you expose them to on a daily basis, adding value to your mind and body.

Guidelines for carpool

- The parking spaces at the north end of the building are going to be designated "staff only" parking. This will minimize traffic in this area during peak carpool times. We ask parents and visitors to park *inside* the lot if they are coming inside the building.
- There will be no student drop-off on Crystal Avenue in the morning. Please follow the normal morning carpool procedure—one line, pulling forward as directed, students exiting the car only after you have pulled past the front doors. This is quick and efficient and only takes a few minutes. Please do not drop your students off in the parking lot unless you are walking into the school with them.
- For afternoon carpool, the gates in the back will be open for 2nd dismissal cars to wait until 5 minutes before that carpool begins. If you are coming inside the building, please park *inside* the parking lot.
- If your students have walking passes, but you intend to pick them up on a given day, please follow the normal carpool procedure OR allow them to walk off campus and meet you on one of the side streets. Please do not park along Crystal Avenue as this creates unsafe and unnecessary congestion during this busy traffic time.

Thank you for your cooperation with this. If you feel you have exceptional circumstances, please schedule a time to meet with the school administration to discuss this.
