September Builder’s Theme – “I am a Builder when I Build with Enthusiasm”

5 Strategies for Building your Enthusiasm – If you want to succeed in any aspect of your life you must have enthusiasm. That’s because it can be drained from you every day. The first thing is **curiosity**. Do you dream about driving the car or owning the home of your dreams? This is curiosity about a certain lifestyle, and that curiosity builds enthusiasm. Think about what you are curious about. If nothing comes to mind, start becoming curious about something!

The next ingredient is **interest**. You have to keep a high interest level about your product, your loved ones, and in new experiences. People who have lost their enthusiasm have also lost their interest. You often hear people say, “I’m not interested in doing that.” Or, “I have no interest in going there.”

The third thing you need to have in addition to curiosity and interest is **knowledge**. Enthusiasm and competence never last long without knowledge. Seek to learn something new every day!

Belief is the fourth ingredient. You must believe that what you are doing is right. Believe in yourself and your product or service. Believe in the changes you can make in other people’s lives – for the better.

The fifth thing you need to have within yourself to generate enthusiasm is **purpose**. Your purpose must transcend making money. You may think being rich brings about enthusiasm, but enthusiasm is even more important when you are down and out with little or no financial reserves. Having enthusiasm helps you to stay motivated and focused for your climb to the top, and in reaching the goals you have set for yourself.

Online Grading Program for K-6

This year, our elementary grades will continue with the online grading program called ALMA. This program will allow elementary parents to check their student's grades and assignments at any time. Although we will still send report cards at the end of each term, we will no longer be sending home paper progress reports as we have in past years. This information will be accessible to parents at any time. We are asking parents to check their student's grades at least once a week. If you are new to American Preparatory Academy, you will receive an e-mail generated by the program that will give you instructions for logging in and creating a password. Your username is your first name dot last name (ex. james.smith).

If you do not receive an e-mail from ALMA, it is because we do not have an e-mail address or current e-mail address in our school records. If you do not receive an e-mail by Wednesday morning, please e-mail Mrs. Melanie Ferlo, Academic Coordinator, at mferlo@apamail.org and give her your updated e-mail address and all of your K-6 students. If you do not have an e-mail address, it will be necessary to get one. These are free and easily made. Your local public library can offer assistance with this. (As can most of your local, friendly teenagers!)

Because we keep very few grades during the first weeks of school as our students are waking up their brains and adjusting to the rigor of their new schedules, there may not be many assignments reported. This is expected. You will see an increase in the number of assignments as the week's progress. We are excited to offer this flexibility to our parents and students and will look forward to the launching of the program next Friday. Thanks in advance for helping us work through the unexpected kinks and tweaks that always accompany this kind of endeavor.

Speech Festival

All of our elementary students will participate in classroom speech festivals. This has been happening this week. They will be memorizing and presenting a poem or monologue or short speech to their classes. Two finalists from each class will then be selected to compete in an elementary-wide festival on September 27th - 4th - 6th at 9:40 - 10:25 am, and 1st - 3rd at 1:15 - 2:00 pm.

Why do we have a Speech Festival? We have Speech Festivals to give students the experience of getting up in front of others and speaking in a place where they are safe. It encourages students to improve their public speaking abilities. And it gives students with a public speaking talent an opportunity to shine.

As you help your student prepare for this event, keep these tips in mind:

- Students can choose their own poem, monologue or short speech or can do something they learned in school.
- The piece should be memorized
- The performance should not go over 2 minutes
- Students are judged on the presentation of the selection, their facial expression, pacing, voice, diction, projection and the way they connect with the audience
- To get full points for connecting with the audience, contestants are encouraged to use a "hook" as an introduction or an end to their selection
- Contestants may wear a simple costume if they would like, use a chair or a stool, and have simple props

Text Message Updates and Reminders

One of the pieces of feedback we received from you through our survey was the need for improving communication. In an effort to improve communication we are introducing a new system called "Remind." Remind is an application which will send a text message to a large group all at once. It works through text message but is only a one-way communication from us to your phone. It will be used sparingly and as a reminder for school events or changes to our normal school day. Our school newsletter will still be the main source of communication and calendaring.

If you would like to opt in to receive communications from the Elementary, please text the message "@k9ge23" to the number 81010. This will activate you into the Elementary Families group. If you have students in both elementary and Junior High, please opt in for both. During Parent Orientation this week we explained this in more detail. If you still have questions, please email or stop by the Jr. High Office or the Elementary Office. We are excited to be able to contact you more quickly when things need to be adjusted.

School Nurse Message

Hello wonderful APA families!

There have been some questions regarding **air quality** and recess time. The policy at APA follows the Utah Asthma Program as well as the EPA's recommendations. Air quality levels are listed as Green/Yellow, Orange, Red and Purple. We use the Utah Department of Environmental Air Quality website to track air quality.

When air quality levels are in the Green/Yellow range we allow all children outside for recess and PE. When air quality levels are in the Orange range we keep those kids who have asthma or a request from a parent on the blue Health Alert form, inside. When air quality levels are in the Red or Purple range everyone is kept inside. If your child has a cold or other respiratory infection, upon request, we will keep them inside on Orange days. We follow CURRENT conditions, not forecasts. Often a forecast of Orange or Red will be on the news. If at recess time the air quality is still in the Green/Yellow range, we allow the kids outside. Immunizations are very important to keep our children safe from preventable communicable diseases. All children entering Kindergarten must be up to date with a second MMR, Varicella, final polio and Tdap immunizations. Those entering 7th grade must have received a Tdap booster, as well as a Meningococcal vaccine. If your child is not properly immunized, you will receive a letter in the mail requesting proof of immunizations. If this documentation is not provided, your child will be excluded from attending school. Professional Qualifications:

Our parent surveys consistently express confidence and overwhelming satisfaction with our teachers at American Prep. Parents are welcome at any time to request information regarding the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teachers including: 1) whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction or whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived; 2) the baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and 3) whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

District Parent Involvement Policy

At the conclusion of each school year, end-of-year assessment data is reported and organized into a Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA). The CNA includes demographic, attendance, and assessment data. Also included in the CNA are the results of the annual Parent Survey. This Survey evaluates, among other things, the satisfaction of parents with the quality of the academic program and their opportunities to participate in the schools. American Preparatory administrators annually invite select staff and parents from each school to participate in a District/School Planning Meeting. This Committee reviews the Comprehensive Needs Assessment and analyzes areas for potential improvement. District/School Plans are developed with goals, action steps, and budget relationships. District and School Parent Involvement Policies are evaluated for effectiveness. School, Parent, and Student Compacts are also examined by this Committee for recommended changes.

Fruit & Vegetable Program

We are excited to bring back our fruit and vegetable program at West Valley 1. This is a great opportunity for the students to experience lots of varieties of fruits and vegetables – with many that the students would never get an opportunity to experience.

NECTARINE - Nectarines come from a natural process of mutation from a peach. They are actually a fuzz free peach. They do have all of the same characteristics except for the fuzz. Because of the lack of fuzz, nectarines generally have a brighter color than a peach. They come in two colors of flesh which are yellow and white. They are a part of the 'stone fruit' family along with peaches, plums, cherries and apricots. Nectarines have high levels of calcium and vitamin C. The first nectarine was believed to have been found growing on a peach tree in the 15th century in the European region. They are a very popular summertime fruit in Utah and are grown primarily in western states.

• Dismissal

1. Students may be released on their own if they have an authorized walking pass *and* the weather/lighting conditions are good; **or**
2. Students may be released to adults who are so authorized on the school and/or afterschool registration materials.
 - a) Authorized adults must physically sign out their students, and may be asked to show identification.
 - b) Students must be picked up promptly within 10 minutes of their assigned dismissal time. Parents who arrive after that time must complete a "Late Pickup" form. Late Pickup forms will be forwarded to the school administration. If parents consistently fail to pick up their students on time, they will be contacted by administration for a conference. If late pickups continue, it will be considered a violation of Acceptance of Policy.
 - c) If necessary, the on-site school administrator may refer students remaining 30 minutes after their assigned dismissal time to Social Services.

If your concern is not resolved satisfactorily, you may request that your grievance go before American Prep's governing board through the parent advocate, who is a member of the board.
