Skyward Wellness Checks—Every Day!

Parents must check their student's temperature each morning and complete the Wellness Screening on Skyward before coming to school. If this is completed before 7:50 am each morning, you no longer need to fill out the paper Wellness Check. We will continue to attach these to the learning plans (for those "just-in-case-I-miss-the-7:50am-deadline" days) but we encourage everyone to access their Skyward account to complete these online. Teachers receive a report at 7:50 each morning, indicating those students that are cleared to be in school that day. If a student is not on the Skyward list, the teachers will check the paper copy attached to the learning plan. Students without one of these wellness verifications will not be able to remain in class.

Information from a district email sent 8/18 regarding Skyward Wellness Screening:

"We invite you all to login tomorrow and test it out so that you are prepared and ready for the first day of school. We ask that you submit this information for each of your On-Campus students each morning by 7:45am. If you have any questions or are having problems logging into Skyward please call the school so that we can assist you."

Academic Extended Day

Academic Extended Day (also known as AED and sometimes as 2nd Dismissal) is an extra 25-minutes of instruction given at the end of the school day. Students who would benefit from this additional instruction time are invited by the Academic Team to participate.

We anticipate starting AED on Tuesday, Sept. 8 following the Labor Day weekend.

If you have received a paper inviting your student to participate, please complete the information and return it to school so your student can begin AED on Sept. 8. Be sure to include the names of siblings and student you carpool with so they will be dismissed at the same time—3:50 on Monday, Tuesday, Friday and 2:50 on Wednesday & Thursday.



THANK YOU if you are a parent that helped make this happen by:

- **Having your carpool # posted clearly in the window & being in the correct line.**
(100s/200s stay to the left, 300s-500s stay to the right. If you need more cards for extra cars, email the front office loveson@apamail.org / shernandez@apamail.org and they will send them home with your student)
- **Picking your student up *at the curb and in your car.***
(For the few of you not doing this yet: Remember--the point of doing carpool this way is to minimize the number of people students and staff are exposed to. Staying in your car helps us accomplish this goal.)
- **Encouraging your student to come outside quickly, looking for your car.**
- **Being willing to pull forward** to allow the most number of cars at the curb and exiting quickly and carefully once you've loaded.

TIP from a Carpool Veteran: If your wait time has been super long, try coming a little later instead of earlier. Dismissal is at 2:25/3:25 (or this Wednesday at 12:15) but the "pick-up window" is 2:25-2:45 / 3:25-3:45. Try coming 10-15 minutes later, and see if that shortens your carpool experience (if that's what you're aiming for!)
