Enrollment for 2022-2023 Is Happening Now! (Week 3 of 4)

We have now begun the 2022-2023 **NEW STUDENT** enrollment process for our current families. We are now accepting applications for new siblings (including kindergarten students) and transfers. Please remember that new kindergarten students must be 5 on or before September 1st to qualify for enrollment; there are no exceptions to this rule. Lotteries will begin on January 3rd so make sure you have completed the application prior to then to increase the likelihood of receiving your priority enrollment status.
