Dear Parent or Guardian:

ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act) requires states to annually identify any public school with one or more "consistently underperforming" student groups for Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI). Student groups include:

EDA	Economically Disadvantaged
SWD	Students with Disabilities
ELL	English Language Learner
AM7	American Indian/Alaska Native
AS7	Asian
BL7	Black/African American
HI7	Hispanic
WH7	Caucasian
MU7	Multiracial
PI7	Pacific Islander

In 2019, over 400 unique schools were identified in the state for TSI for one or more student groups. Over 500 were identified in 2022. (There were no schools identified in 2020 or 2021 due to COVID.)

We are writing to let you know that <u>APA-The School for New Americans</u> (WV1) has not been identified for any new TSI groups since 2019, and that the PI7 group has exited TSI status. We are also pleased to report that the standardized assessment, and other metrics for our BL7 students exceeded the 5% benchmark in 2022. We are still working to improve the outcomes of these students, as well as our ELL, HI7, and SWD students who were identified in 2019.

APA-WV1 annually engages stakeholders in developing and implementing a school-level plan to improve student outcomes based on the indicators in the statewide accountability system for these student groups. The plan meets the following requirements:

- 1. Interventions that meet ESSA's evidence-based requirements
- 2. Identification of resources to provide for those interventions (if applicable)
- 3. Approval from American Prep's executive academic leadership
- 4. Monitoring from American Prep's executive academic leadership

A TSI school remains in this designation for 4 years and will exit when, for two consecutive years, the school no longer has student groups performing below the associated cut scores in the state's accountability system.
