Changes to Kindergarten Schedule for the First 3 Days of School (Week 2 of 4)

One of exciting decisions made during our post-service admin meetings was to make the first three days of school for kindergarten 12:15 dismissal days. On August 16, 17, 18, kindergarten students will be dismissed at 12:15 pm. Dismissal times for grades 1-6 will remain at the regular time. Kindergarten teachers will be using the afternoons of these days to complete the one-on-one Kindergarten entry testing (KEEP) required by the state. Signups for those testing times will come later this summer.

2023-2024 Uniform Guide Available on the Website

The 2023-2024 Uniform Guide has been posted to the website under Parent Resources. www.americanprep.org/topic/uniforms/

Most of the information about uniforms remains the same as last year, with a couple updates to note:

- 1. Updated language about body art and tattoos.
- 2. New language about nail length.
- 3. All leggings will be navy or black—no white leggings. White tights are still acceptable in elementary.
- 4. One piercing in each ear rule—updated to include girls and boys.
- 5. Elementary will now have 2 spirit days per month.
- 7. The hair section has changed to: Hair that is an unnatural color or extreme styling is distracting and not allowed. For boys or girls, hair must be trimmed or pulled back in a hair tie if it is in the eyes, covering the face or otherwise distracting. Faux hawks must be shorter than 3" and of graduated height from the other hair. No mohawks.

Uniforms—Do a Quick Check and Don't Get Tricked! (Week 2 of 3)

We know you like to get things right the first time—so here are a few pointers as you get your student's uniform ready for the first day of school.

- 1. Review the uniform guide. If you don't have a hard copy to study, it can be found on the School Website, under Parent Library/Parent Resources. https://www.americanprep.org/topic/uniforms/
- 2. Pull out last year's uniforms and check to see that the pieces still fit correctly and that they are in good condition. Holes or tears will need to be mended, stains removed and hems may need to be let down. (Uniforms should be clean, in good repair/skirts to the knee.)
- 3. If your student says, "It will be okay. I (or "people in my class") wore those all the time last year and no



one said anything about it," be suspicious! Better double check to make sure it is in line with the uniform guide. Here are some don't-get-tricked examples.


- White polos vs. blouses/regular dress shirts. Remember that white polos are part of the K-3 uniform, but not part of the 4-6 uniform. 4-6 students wear regular blouses and dress shirts. (Note: If you buy button down collars for your child, the shirt needs to be worn properly with the buttons buttoned. Consider shirt collars without buttons if this is a challenge.)
- Shoes. Any kind of all black shoe. Comfortable, low heeled styles work best—but be sure they are all black. Are black shoes with white soles okay? Or black shoes with colored stripes or insignia? Nope—just all black.
- Boys khaki uniform pants. These need to be uniform style pants. Not khaki jeans. Not khaki joggers. Not khaki cargo pants. Check the color carefully to get the right color khaki.
- Girls navy uniform slacks. If you choose this uniform option, be sure you purchase uniform style dress slacks. Not navy leggings or skinny style pants.
- Hair accessories or religious head coverings. These should be non-distracting and in colors that match the uniform: navy blue, red, white or black.


2023-2024 West Valley 1 Campus Morning Carpool (One Line)
