Recently, I had the opportunity to sit in on a conversation between a student and one of our West Valley City police officers. I was very impressed with the officer—he was so kind and gentle with the student—and SO wise. The officer asked the student what he thought was the worst possible thing that could happen in consequence to what had happened. The student replied, "Being suspended." This, he agreed, was a tough consequence, but said, "There is something worse that could happen." He went on to share that having someone lose trust with you because you didn't or wouldn't tell the truth was even a bigger deal. He explained that when we've made a mistake—even a big mistake—but we admit it with perfect honesty, own it and take responsibility for it, people respect that.

I was grateful to be part of this lesson on honesty, so compassionately shared by this officer. Being perfectly honest is challenging at times, but so worth our every effort.

#### Mandated Assessments and Opt-Outs (Week 4 of 4)

American Preparatory recognizes that Standardized Testing is an essential tool for measuring student learning and teacher success. The data obtained from these assessments may be utilized by teachers and administrators to review student academic progress, plan instruction, and share with students and parents. Summative assessments allow for data to be used in public reporting about school quality. Parent's may opt-out of most state standardized tests by submitting a Parental Exclusion form to the Academic Director.
