"Lights On" Family Event - Important things to know for Friday.

We are excited for this Friday's "Lights On" event from 3:30-5:30pm. There will be fun for everyone in the family! Here's some important info:

- All students will be dismissed at 3:25. There is no 2nd dismissal and no Sistema on Friday.
- You will need to know your **CARPOOL/FAMILY NUMBER** to sign-in. (Check your carpool tag)
- On Thursday, a link to the sign-in form will be emailed out to allow you to pre-register.
- If you pre-register successfully before 3:00pm on Friday, you will just need to show your confirmation e-mail on your phone to enter and receive your "punch cards." The gates will open by 3:15.
- If you are pre-registered before 3:00pm, You will pick up your students in the gym.
- If you do not pre-register before 3:00pm, your student(s) will be waiting at the carpool curb and you will pick them up there. You will sign in on your phone using the posted QR codes and then show the confirmation e-mail at the gate to enter. Staff will be on hand if you need help.
- The entrance to Lights On is the gate at the south end of the parking lot. The gate will open by 3:15pm.
- Parking in our lot is limited. After carpool is complete, we will begin to offer diagonal parking along the curb. If you park along Crystal
 Avenue, please be courteous and careful to not block our neighbors' driveways or mailboxes. Reminder: There is never any parking on the
 private lane behind the school.
- Orange carpool parents, *please note that the "orange" lane through the parking spots will not be available* on this day. Follow the blue lane until directed to move forward to the orange waiting spot.

- There will be a **Students vs. Parents/Staff soccer game at 4:45**. If you are a player or even just a good sport, please come with your gear so you can join in the fun! The students love to play against the adults—help us make a team!
- Each member of your family will receive a *punch card*. You can receive punches by visiting the community partner tables (indicated by balloons.) When your punch card is complete, you can turn it in for a prize at the punch card prize booth. Note: don't turn it in before you've had food; you will need it for the food line too.
- Remember, this is a free event for all! We will be outside—so come prepared with hats, sunscreen, water bottles, and, if you'd like, lawn chairs or blankets. It is going to be fun!

Compliance Items:

Professional Qualifications (Week 2 of 4)

Our parent surveys consistently express confidence and overwhelming satisfaction with our teachers at American Prep. In accordance with state regulation, all APA teachers are licensed through one of three licensing paths: Professional, Associates and LEA specific. Parents are welcome at any time to request information regarding the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teachers including: 1) whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction or whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived; 2) the baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and 3) whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

District Parent and Family Engagement Policy (Week 1 of 4)

American Prep recognizes that parent and family engagement is key to student achievement. We provide many opportunities for parents and family members to participate in, and stay informed of, their student's academic achievement.

American Preparatory Academy trains staff annually during pre-service and teacher academy on how to communicate, build meaningful connections, and otherwise involve parents/families and the school. These topics are reinforced during professional development opportunities throughout the year as needed. Mandated Assessments and Opt-Outs (Week 1 of 4)

American Preparatory recognizes that Standardized Testing is an essential tool for measuring student learning and teacher success. The data obtained from these assessments may be utilized by teachers and administrators to review student academic progress, plan instruction, and share with students and parents. Summative assessments allow for data to be used in public reporting about school quality. Parent's may opt-out of most state standardized tests by submitting a Parental Exclusion form to the Academic Director.
